

What's open, what's closed

Garbage

Household pickup cancelled everywhere but Etobicoke. Yard waste, white goods (e.g. fridges and stoves), household hazardous waste, and ElectroVan and HazMobile collection is cancelled everywhere.

Pools

Closed, including wading pools. Newer splash pads are automated, and can be used.

Community centres

Closed, except for:

Beaches

Open and lifeguard-patrolled, but water monitoring cancelled.

Weddings

Ceremonies will continue as usual at Toronto City Hall, but only previously scheduled ceremonies are taking place at Etobicoke Civic Centre. Wedding services in Scarborough, East York and York civic centres are closed.

Parks

All recreational programming cancelled. Parks are open "for casual use only," but don't go on a full bladder, or expect immaculate green spaces: Park washrooms are closed and maintenance cancelled. All park-use permits (including wedding photography) are cancelled.

Parking permits

Not being issued, but if you get a parking ticket in an area for which you've been unable obtain a permit, your ticket will be cancelled when you obtain your new permit.

Libraries

Open, except for Armour Heights, Flemingdon Park, St. James Town, Todmorden Room and Port Union.

Ferries

Cancelled. Special boats chartered for island residents.

Council and committee meetings

Cancelled.

Public buildings

City Hall, North York Civic Centre, Metro Hall, York Civic Centre and Scarborough Civic Centre - Ground floors open Monday to Friday, 8 am. to 4:30 p.m., if you make it past picket lines. City Hall is still receiving legal documents, freedom-of-information requests, issuing marriage licences and burial permits, and registering births and deaths. All City Hall visits, tours and educational programs are cancelled.

Museums and Galleries

Closed: Colborne Lodge, Fort York National Historic Site, Gibson House Museum, Historic Zion House, Mackenzie House, Montgomery's Inn, Scarborough Historical Museum, Spadina Museum: Historic House & Gardens, Todmorden Mills Heritage Museum & Arts Centre, York Museum.
