Massive recovery of bikes, Update, 250 people reunited with their bikes, Many more bikes waiting, 14 Division

On Wednesday, July 16, 2008, the 14 Division Community Response Unit (CRU) began a bicycle-theft investigation.

It is alleged that:

- the owner of The Bicycle Clinic, 927 Queen Street West, was witnessed directing a person to steal bicycles in the area of the store.

Igor Kenk, 49, of Toronto, and Jean Laveau, 47, of Toronto, are each charged with:

- 1) Theft,
- 2) Attempt Theft,
- 3) Possession of Stolen Property,
- 4) Possession of Burglar Tools.

As of this morning, 250 people have recovered their bicycles; 165 of those took place over the weekend.

14 Division Superintendent Ruth White said, "While we are very pleased that 250 people have recovered their bikes so far, we would encourage anyone who has lost a bike to make every effort to visit the two locations where a large number of bikes are currently on display."

From today through Thursday, July 31, 2008, from noon to 8 p.m., the bikes are available for viewing at 35 Strachan Avenue and 30 Ordnance Street.

Those who attend to recover their bicycles should be prepared to offer proof of ownership, such as receipts or store registrations. Owner identification will be required. Photo ID is preferred. Police officers will be present to register bicycles.
