City's grants aid community groups and agencies

The City funds a number of community groups and agencies to provide or assist in the delivery of programs and services. Grants leverage the work of community volunteers to provide services to communities most in need. As part of the grants review process increasing the accountability of our grants process will ensure the City continues to benefit from this valuable program. The City will also continue to examine how best to coordinate the assistance the City provides to community groups with that of other levels of government.

The total 2002 Consolidated Grants net budget request is \$35,235,410.00.
