City Council Approves new funding of \$965 Million for 2003 Tax Supported Capital Budget

Today, Toronto City Council approved a 2003 tax supported Capital Budget of \$965.082 million. The budget is comprised of new projects with cash flow of \$474.056 million and previously approved projects of \$491.026 million.

In addition, Council approved spending on previously approved projects with carry forward budgets from 2002 to 2003 totaling \$142.650 million gross and \$78.003 million debt. These expenditures were approved in 2002 and will have no incremental financing impact in 2003.

In accordance with Council guidelines, the 2003 Approved Capital Budget was prioritized within five categories resulting in the following allocations:

Debt Financing

Debt financing associated with the 2003 capital budget totals \$252.573 million (excluding 2002 carry forwards). This assumes that the Provincial and Federal Governments will contribute one-third each toward financing of the projects included in the 2003 capital budget for the TTC. Other significant financing sources include reserves for \$131.484 million and Capital from Current of \$124.172 million.

Council also approved 2003 Gross Capital Expenditures of \$190.223 million for Rate supported programs (excluding carry-forwards of \$84.626 million). The Rate supported budget is entirely financed from the water rate and other non-tax revenue sources.

CHILDREN'S SERVICES

<u>Budget - \$6.309 M gross comprised of \$3.261 M previously approved and \$3.048 M of new and ongoing projects [2002 Gross Budget - \$3.1M]</u>

- \$0.500 M for upgrading approximately 24 playgrounds to the required safety standards.
- \$2.397 M for the completion of a childcare centre for 98 children at 5182/5200 Yonge Street, to be funded from development agreements with Imperial Oil Ltd. and Sam-Sor Enterprises Inc., and the Child Care Capital Reserve Fund.

- State of Good Repair is 68% of gross expenditures for bridges, expressways, roadways & system infrastructure.
- Continuation of red light camera program.
- Provides for commencement of Front Street Extension project.

FIRE SERVICES

Budget: \$19.392 M gross comprised of \$8.225 M previously approved and \$11.167 M new and ongoing projects. [2002 Gross Budget – \$9.64 M]

- Completion of purchase of the Toryork property for use by several programs as part of the Facilities Rationalization Plan.
- State of Good Repair is 78% of gross expenditures for the Asset Management program for Fire Services Facilities and alerting and dispatch system improvements.
- CAD/RMS Computer Aided Dispatch and Records Management System: completion of Phase 1 purchase of mobile equipment and acceptance testing.

- \$28.939 M for land acquisition to construct a new 11 Division, a new Police College, a new 23 Division, a new 54 Division, and the relocation of current Traffic Services and Central Garage Facility due to the proposed Front Street expansion resulted from the Waterfront Development Program.

- \$3.6 M for a Children's Wildlife Discovery project, including \$0.600 M of Toronto Zoo Foundation funding, will complete the Children's Zoo area.
- \$0.203 M for a Canadian Wilderness Feasibility Study to develop plans for the future relocation of the Canadian Domain, a project focusing on the future fund raising by the Toronto Zoo Foundation.
- \$0.906 M for building & services refurbishment to upgrade and refurbish electrical service infrastructure, fire alarm systems, emergency generator, roofs, and other mechanical equipment.
- \$0.573 M for Exhibit Refurbishments to make safety improvements to the Elephant Paddock, and design for the refurbishment of the Americas Pavilion.

Budget: \$6.452M gross, (\$4.007M debt) comprised of \$0.65M previously approved, and \$5.802 of new projects. [2002 Gross Budget - \$5.715M]

- \$1.657 M for the Waterfront development of the 2003 phase including major sites such as Ashbridge's Bay, Tommy Thompson Park and the Mimico apartment strip.
- \$1.2 M for Waterfront and valley erosion control including major sites such as Toronto parks sites, Toronto Islands, and Fishleigh Drive.

- \$55.598 M for funding the Works Best Practices Program to improve efficiency and security of the Water and Wastewater facilities.
- \$2.5 M for initial funding to begin implementation of Universal Water Metering Reading System.
- \$6.839 M for funding of the Water Efficiency Program.
